1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

The College prepares a detailed prospectus which contains information regarding courses, curriculum, fee structure, achievements, and activity calendar for every academic year. Moreover, it also informs students about ordinances (issued by Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University Amravati) related to sexual harassment, anti-ragging, indiscipline and attendance. The first day of every academic year is the Orientation for all students . In this Orientation Programme, the faculty members are introduced to the students. Every department holds an individual orientation programme, where the academic calendar, syllabus, examination pattern and the time table of the department is communicated to the students. Well-stocked library, computer labs with Wi-Fi connectivity are offered to all the students and faculty. Wi-Fi logins are also provided to all the students to access e-journals and online database of library, subscribed by College. There one computer labs that are accessible to students and teachers for internet access. The college library has a vast collection of 5700 books in various disciplines, and of general interest. The library also has subscribed to over 06 periodicals, popular magazines, encyclopedias, journals and newspapers. The library also provides access to online journals and has an online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) and WEB OPAC. Library is using integrated Library Management Software since 202 and also using Library power back KOHA and Barcode technology. There is a spacious reading room in the library which provides internet access to students and faculty. The College auditorium which is with state-of-the-art audio-visual system and stage lighting arrangements and a seating capacity of around 120 students gives the appropriate infrastructure to most of the departments, to organize curricular activities. 03 classrooms in the college have LCD Projectors, to assist the audiovisual mode of teaching. #### 2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

### 2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The students admitted in our college are coming from various economic sections and communities of the society. Most of the students are from backward categories i.e. ST, SC, and OBC. The college is very much aware about their overall growth and social upliftment in the society. After the completion of admission process regular classes commence as per the college time table. The institution always girl students for enrolment in college in order to equip them with the higher education so that they can become empowered at themselves to face the future competition and to create their own entity.

After admissions college adopts a process to identify slow and advance learners among students. Advanced learners and slow learners are identified on as per their responses in the class room as well as the performance in the Unit test, internal examinations. After knowing slow an advanced learners, the teachers prepare separate list of slow and advance learners and conduct extra lectures for weaker students. The teachers observe that whether the student are easily understanding the lesson. If they fail to understand the topic or teaching of a teacher, the

same was having been explained again in a easy way. This is the informal way to complete the teaching-learning process and it is also convenient to both teacher and students. Advanced learners are encouraged to ask their concern freely and frequently with the teachers, in a formal way. Students are encouraged to refer advanced textbooks, journals and for their advanced studies. Home assignment and projects are taken prepared from the Students. They are also encouraged to apply for different competitive examinations. They are motivated to participate in seminar presentation, Poster presentation, quiz competition, debates, Youth Festival etc.

#### 2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Teaching-learning methods adopted by the faculty members include Lecture Method, Interactive Method, Project-based Learning, Computer-assisted Learning, Experiential Learning etc. The Teaching - learning activities are made effective through illustration and special lectures. To acquire first-hand knowledge on the subjects and current practices students are engaged in study. Some lessons are taught through Power point presentations to make learning interesting besides oral presenting methods.

#### Lecture method:

This conventional method is commonly adopted by all the teachers, especially language teachers. This method facilitates the teacher to interpret, explain and revise the content of a text only for better understanding of the subject by the learners.

#### Interactive method:

The faculty members make learning interactive with students by motivating student participation in group discussion, role-play, subject quiz, news analysis, educational games, discussion and questions and answers on current affairs.

#### ICT Enabled Teaching:

ICT enabled teaching includes Wi-Fi enabled class rooms with LCD, E-learning resources. Virtual class room links the guest lecture of eminent persons to develop their core knowledge in the subject. The institution adopts modern pedagogy in line with emerging trends to enhance teaching-learning process. The institution has the essential equipments to support the faculty members and students.

Regular practical sessions, Use of LCD projectors for seminars and workshops, Productive use of educational videos, Accessibility of non-print material for students. Job oriented courses are offered by Department of Commerce. Communication skills training is provided to students during Language department Course. Online reference, lecture talks, motivational talks, educational videos and web reference support the teaching-learning process. The institution has installed Wi-Fi on the campus to support the educational activities of the inmates. All the departments provide instructional materials to the students for easy follow-up / understanding the concepts on the college website. Learning resources and useful websites are made available in the college website, which serve as a ready link to access the portals of information and gain knowledge.

#### Group Learning Method:

Group Learning allows the slow learners to develop problem solving, interpersonal, presentational and communication skills to confirm quality in learning with Peer Group. Under group learning, heterogeneous group of students comprising Fast, Average and Slow learners are divided into groups of 5 to 10 members. Group Discussion, Management Games, Group Projects or Assignments are conducted by the Engilsh and Commerce department under group learning method.

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#### 2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

In order to ensure transparency in internal assessment, the system of internal assessment is communicated with the students well in time. The college has transparent and robust evaluation process in terms of frequency and variety. The Principal holds meetings of the faculties and directs them to ensure effective implementation of the evaluation process. Students who are admitted in the are assessed continuously through various evaluation processes at college and University level. Continuous evaluation is made through Group Discussion, Unit Tests, Assignments Submission, Field Visit / Field Work and Seminars Presentation. Unit tests are conducted regularly as per the schedule given in academic calendar. The performance of the students is communicated to the students. Personal guidance is given to the poor performing the students after their assessment. Students appearing for Second /third year are asked to deliver the seminars of the concerned subject. Topics are given by their teachers to the students to prepare for power point presentation.

For transparent and robust for internal assessment, the following mechanisms are conducted

- 5) Interaction with students regarding their internal assessement.

The method of internal assessment helps the teachers to evaluate the students more appropriately. Due to internal assessment, the interest of the student towards learning and attending the classes has been also increased. It has created the interest among the students to take active participation in various co-curricular and extra-curricular activities for their overall personality development. - 1) The assessed Unit test papers are shown to the students for self-assessment
- 2) In case of any grievances regarding internal assessment, the student is free to interact with the teacher and get it resolved. The unresolved grievance, if any, is referred to the Principal and Examination grievances cell through the Head of the Department.
- 3) As per the university norms, following are the methods of grievance redressal regarding university assessment: Right to apply for verification of answer books, verification with photocopy of answer books, challenge the evaluation of answer books.
- 4) The candidate who appeared to university examination can apply to the university within a period of 15 days from the date of declaration of the concerned examination result in the prescribed form for verification of marks of his answer-books. The result of the verification of marks is communicated to the candidate concerned, within a period of 30 days from the last date of receipt of application by the university.
- 5) The student has the option to apply for the photocopy and verification of marks of the preceding examination.
- 6) The college takes special initiative for resolving group grievances, if any, regarding university assessments.

The students are encouraged, guided to learn and imbibe these outcomes. They are also percolated to students through organization and participation of cocurricular and extracurricular activities. Every department plans and conducts all activities in light of the programme outcomes, course outcomes. There are certain ways to assess whether the programme outcomes have been achieved or not. The performance of students in university examinations and in different internal examinations is a parameter of outcome assessment. For the assessment of students, summative and formative approaches are followed to get intended learning outcomes. The teaching-learning and assessment processes are reviewed by the IQAC through academic and Administrative Audit. It includes an external peer team member. Records of academic results and other achievements are maintained by the departments or the units. They are submitted to the IQAC at the

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end of academic year. The feedback obtained from students on the teaching- learning process help to understand the expected learning outcomes. Secondly, the students overall performance in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities as well as his behavior on and off the campus help to judge the programme or course outcomes.
